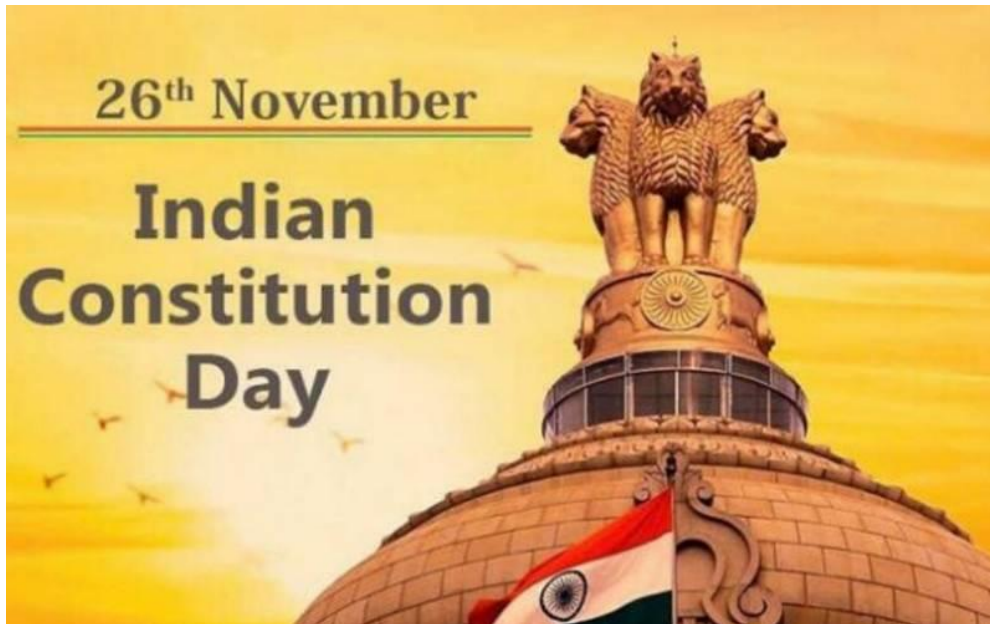


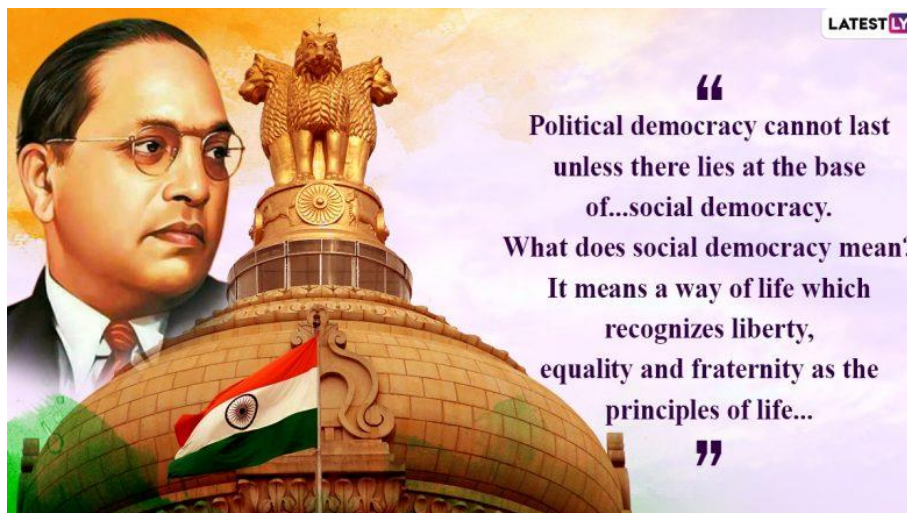
Constitution day Celebrations on 26th November 2020

PREAMBLE TO CONSTITUTION



WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA,
having solemnly resolved to constitute India
into a **SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC**
REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:
JUSTICE, social, economic and political;
LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;
EQUALITY of status and of opportunity;
and to promote among them all
FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and
the unity and integrity of the Nation;
IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this 26th day of
November, 1949, do **HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE**
TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

CONSTITUTIONAL PLEDGE

I, as a citizen of India affirm my faith in the universal principle of civilized society namely that every dispute between citizens, groups, institutions or organizations of citizens, should be settled by peaceful means; and in view of the growing danger to the integrity and unity of the country, I hereby pledge myself never to resort to physical violence in the case of any dispute, whether in my neighborhood or in any other part of India.
